★ ★ Classic HUMBOLDT FORUM AND MUSEUM ISLAND: RECONSTRUCTIONS AND ADDITIONS

The redevelopment of the UNESCO World Heritage Site according to David Chipperfield's master plan is the largest inner-city project in Berlin since the opening of Potsdamer Platz. The reopening of the New Museum and the construction of a new central entrance building, the James Simon Gallery, complete the war-damaged ensemble and point the way to a modern museum landscape of the 21st century. Franco Stella's new building

opposite the Altes Museum boasts reconstructed façades of the baroque Berlin City Palace on three outer sides and in its inner courtyards. The fourth side facing the river Spree was designed in a contemporary style. The controversial building will be illuminated in the context of this guided tour.

★ ★ Classic A CUT THROUGH THE INNER CITY

On this guided tour, we lay a cross-section through Berlin's city centre and present both historical and contemporary projects. The route combines diverse aspects of current urban development. Parallel to Friedrichstraße, we present the innovative residential and commercial hub near the former flower market and the new Springer Campus media centre by Rem Koolhaas. The House of One, a place of prayer for the three

world religions and the project for a river bath in the centre of Berlin are just as important for urban society as the Humboldt Forum and the James Simon Gallery by David Chipperfield.

Classic BERLIN OVERVIEW: CITY WEST TO ALEXANDERPLATZ BY BIKE

Berlin, with its chequered history and decentralised structure, is a vast and diverse city. The bike tour starts in City West and gives an impressive cross-section of Berlin: on well-developed bike paths, through residential areas and green spaces, it leads eastwards to Alexanderplatz. It connects impressive public buildings such as the Neue Nationalgalerie with future developments in the Park am Gleisdreieck and highlights contemporary architecture as well as past and future urban development in equal measure. From your bike, you will experience a new perspective on spaces and paths and discover little-known places such as the Flussbad project site in the middle of the city.

$\star\star$ Classic THE PARLIAMENTARY DISTRICT AND PARISER PLATZ

Along the river Spree, the architecture of political power with the so-called "ribbon of the federation" is particularly impressive. The Federal Government's move from Bonn to Berlin completely changed its architectural representation. After historically modest buildings in the provinces of Bonn, the new parliamentary district is now characterised by buildings of high symbolic value: Norman Foster with his

glass walk-in dome of the Reichstag building, the architects Schultes and Frank with the characteristic spatial composition of the Federal Chancellery and the slender columns of the Houses of Representatives by Stephan Braunfels stand for a new way of building in a modern democracy.

★ ★ ★ Extra WILD WEDDING: ARCHITECTURE AND SUBCULTURE

In the formerly deeply proletarian working-class district Wedding, a creative scene has been sprouting for years, mostly housed in converted industrial and transport buildings. Now new architectural paths are being taken in residential and commercial construction that do not follow the usual gentrification processes. Raw concrete and modular timber construction help to build quickly and cost-effectively beyond conventional

building techniques. The Lobe House, for example, which has become famous beyond the borders of Berlin, imaginatively exploits the possibilities of the building code and creates a distinctive place with large, staggered terraces accessible to the public.

★★ Classic THE NEW CULTURAL FORUM AND POTSDAMER PLATZ

The walk starts at the old and future site of the Bauhaus Archive. Here, the restoration of the building with the destinctive shed roofs in accordance with the conservation regulations and its expansion are currently under way. Along the Landwehr Canal with exciting buildings dating back to the International Building Exhibition of the 1980s, the tour leads to the Kulturforum, which has once again become an architectural highlight

boasting the reopened the reopened New National Gallery and the much-discussed Museum of the 20th Century, currently under construction.

Designs by two Bauhaus directors - Walter Gropius and Ludwig Mies van der Rohe - as well as the influences of modern Bauhaus ideas and the future of the Kulturforum will be examined more closely during the tour.

★ Classic HOUSING PROJECTS OF THE 50IES: HANSAVIERTEL

Like its counterpart Karl-Marx-Allee, this large urban development from the post-war period is on its way to becoming a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Both large-scale complexes represent different political systems that implemented housing construction of the highest standard in a wide variety of ways. The buildings of the Interbau 1957, designed by over 50 renowned architects, were experimental and innovative:

the Hansaviertel celebrated the revival of an international modernism. To this day, you can find sophisticated floor plans showcasing the entire range of communal living, from private bungalows to rows of terraced houses to residential high-rise buildings.

★ 🛨 Classic HOUSING PROJECTS OF THE 50IES: KARL-MARX-ALLEE

The large urban development from the post-war period is a candidate for another UNESCO World Heritage Site. Together with Hansaviertel in the west of Berlin, it represents housing construction typical of the period under different political systems. The former Stalinallee followed a "national tradition" with representative façades and floor plans. The monumental avenue was to provide the young GDR with spacious workers'

palaces. On the guided tour from the Cinema International to Frankfurter Tor, we show you the various construction phases and special buildings of the avenue and also let you look behind the façades of the perfect showpiece buildings.

🛨 🛨 Classic NEW ARCHITECTURE IN MITTE: VOLKSBÜHNE TO HACKESCHE HÖFE

Berlin's only preserved old town lies not in its centre, but right next door. The neighbourhood around the Hackesche Höfe attracts the most tourists besides the Brandenburg Gate, but the real gems of the area once named "Spandauer Vorstadt" are only discovered by criss-crossing through its hidden courtyards, parks and small squares. A vibrant art and gallery scene has developed in the former Jewish quarter, taking root in old factories or in narrow lots with some strikingly

high-quality architecture. Right in the middle of it, framed by housing developments by the father of modernism Hans Poelzig, lies the famous Volksbühne, built at the beginning of the 20th century and still one of the city's most influential theatres.

★ ★ Classic EUROPACITY

If you turn away from the government district at the main train station and head towards Europacity, you will see the undulating glass façade of the new high-rise building at Europaplatz: the headquarters of KPMG. It will be completed in 2023 as the third and last element of the city crown planned there as an entrance to Europacity. It is almost 10 years since the first building was opened there, the Tour Total by architects Barkow Leibinger. At that time,

the area north of Berlin's main train station was still a barren wasteland. Berlin's urban policy and the requirements for new buildings and neighbourhoods have changed completely since then. The Europacity is therefore often disdained as a "dumping ground for concrete gold". And yet it is worth taking a look at the many new buildings along Heidestraße, which, especially in the western part, boast bold large-scale forms and sophisticated architecture. 2.5 h from 490,- Euro







★ ★ Classic ONE CITY TWO CENTRES: THE NEW ALEXANDERPLATZ

25 years ago, great plans were made for Alexanderplatz. Thirteen high-rises were to mark the historic centre of Berlin according to Hans Kollhoff's master plan and turn Alexanderplatz into a worthy metropolitan square - the plans were on hold for a long time, but now things are getting underway; three new high-rises are already under construction. But buildings of the formerly unloved GDR modernism are also experiencing a new appreciation. The multi-layered House of Statistics, saved by

committed citizens, and the Pressehaus with its rotating advertising drum and large-scale artwork are being restored. The tour introduces the history of the square, the famous train station and the current above-ground developments of architecture and urban development at Alexanderplatz.

★ ★ Classic ONE CITY TWO CENTRES: CITY WEST

Berlin has two main centres: one in the former east and one in the western part of the city.

Around the Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church with the Europa Center at Zoo station, the commercial centre of the walled-in city has asserted itself.

The revitalisation of the Bikini building and the Zoo Palast cinema has created a new concept mall and entertainment mile that further develops the heritage of the 1950s and creates innovative

shopping opportunities. The construction of two new high-rise buildings, the Upper West Tower and the Waldorf Astoria Hotel, has added two architecturally significant landmarks to West Berlin's central district. Discover the new old City West with us!

★ ★ ★ Extra URBAN TIMBER CONSTRUCTIONS

Timber construction is becoming increasingly important in the urban context. Initially, individual gaps were filled with seven-storey wooden structures, but now sophisticated ensembles have been created in residential construction. Schools and kindergartens are also increasingly being planned in wood. With the Schumacher Quarter, a pioneering, largely car-free quarter with 5,000 flats in sustainable timber construction with green

façades is being built on part of the site of Tegel Airport. In consultation with you, we will arrange the focus of this tour individually and organise exclusive interior tours!

★ ★ ★ Extra INDUSTRIAL REVITALISATION AT RUMMELSBURG BAY

Discover the start-up worlds and building co-op projects along the "Lichtenberg South Coast"!

Set in a breathtaking waterfront location, a new piece of Berlin has been growing for several years in the golden triangle between Friedrichshain, Lichtenberg and Oberschöneweide. Where ice blocks were once stored and coal was shipped, innovative working worlds, studios and flats are now being built. On our guided bike tour you

will gain insights into the history of the area and current plans. In addition to new architecture such as the City Marina and the Spree Studios, you will pass the site of the former Rummelsburg prison, where young families now live. The tour ends at the impresive Funkhaus Nalepastraße.

★ ★ ★ Extra CONTEMPORARY RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS IN KREUZBERG

For almost thirty years, the Berlin Wall ran as an insurmountable border between the two Berlin districts of Kreuzberg and Mitte. In 1990 it was demolished, leaving behind large inner-city wastelands. Today there are exciting housing projects to be discovered in this former no-man's land – many built by building groups. These private initiatives give more weight to aesthetics and ecology than to financial aspects. The result

is a varied and innovative architecture in which sustainability and community play an important role. The route along the former Wall strip starts at the Spreefeld building group project and leads via Engeldamm and Engelbecken to Moritzplatz.

★ ★ ★ Extra ANYTHING GOES: INTERNATIONAL BUILDING EXHIBITION OF 1987

How do we want to live? What does the city of today look like and how do we shape the future? The International Building Exhibition in what was then West Berlin not only discussed these questions theoretically, but also put them into practice - with new housing concepts that promised social compatibility and innovative living concepts. On the guided tour, you will rediscover places and learn all about the special

features of the architecture of the 1980s with the help of floor plans and planning material. Pictorial and expressive buildings are the focus of the tour. In addition to the Ritterstraße Nord area, the tour leads to the unique residential courtyards of Hinrich and Inken Baller on Fraenkelufer.

★ ★ Extra MODERN LIVING: MODERNIST HOUSING ESTATES

In Berlin, the ideas of new, modern, light-flooded living were implemented in a unique form in the 1920s. The six green World Heritage housing estates were built as a counter-design to the tenement misery of Berlin's working-class families that prevailed until then. In 2008, they were inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List due to their social aspirations and their outstanding significance for 20th century urban planning and

architecture. As part of a day tour, you can visit all six estates or explore the architecture of one or two settlements on a half-day tour.

★ 🖈 Extra MODERN BUILDING: 1920s BERLIN

The Bauhaus movement is known throughout the world and is valued as the most influential school of the 20th century in the fields of architecture, art and design. In addition to buildings by well-known Bauhäusler such as Walter Gropius and Ludwig Mies van der Rohe, Berlin paints a more complex picture of Classical Modernism with buildings by Erich Mendelsohn, Bruno Taut, Wassili and Hans Luckhardt with Alfons Anker. In the 1920s,

outstanding examples of New Building were created here in the wake of the nearby Bauhaus in Dessau. Alongside the six UNESCO settlements and Le Corbusier's Unité, they enrich the palette of modern architecture in Berlin.

★ ★ ★ Premium BERLIN BRUTALISM: CONCRETE CONSTRUCTIONS

The new material aesthetics of the 1960s and 70s in raw, often artfully worked exposed concrete shaped important years of building in Berlin.

Numerous buildings from this period, some of them public, are at the centre of controversial discussions today: While they are not necessarily the darlings of the general public due to their "honest" construction methods, they exert a special fascination for experts and the younger

generations. Thus, even monument conservation is gradually recognising their epochal and unique significance. Churches such as St. Agnes in Kreuzberg, today used as an art gallery, show the transformability of the supposedly bulky buildings from the economic boom era.

★★★★ Premium Material BRICK

Everywhere in Berlin's countryside you come across old clay pits and brickworks. Without them, the rapid growth of the capital during its founding period would have been impossible. In the majority of houses, the bricks have disappeared behind plaster, but there are some representative brick buildings in Berlin - just think of the Red City Hall. In recent years, the material has experienced a renaissance and is increasingly being used in con-

temporary projects such as David Chipperfield's New Museum or the planned "House of One". The material decisively shapes the look and feel of a building - this guided tour focuses on it.

🛨 Single buildings JACOB-UND-WILHELM-GRIMM-ZENTRUM

The new library of Humboldt University by Max Dudler brings together the previously scattered book collections in one of the largest open access libraries in Germany. The winning design, which emerged from a competition, is not only characterised by its clarity and rationality, but also impresses with its high material quality and particular urban planning restraint. The heart of the new library is the atrium, illuminated by a

skylight ceiling, in which two cascade-like terrace levels face each other.

The group size for visiting the library is limited to 25 people. Larger groups must be divided.

Single buildings BAUMSCHULENWEG CREMATORY

At the same time as the Federal Chancellery, a new crematorium was built in the Berlin district of Treptow by the architects Schultes und Frank. The centrepiece is a ten-metre-high columned hall which, as a connecting roof, unites three ceremonial halls to form a "square under the stars", the "Campo Stella". The ancient models of the Egyptian temple complex of Sakkara or the Arab mosque in Cordoba were transferred into a

modern architecture of exposed concrete, natural stone floors and concrete columns with the light capitals typical of the authors. The contemplative character of the cathedral-like space of massive walls, columns, light and shadow is unique.

★ Single buildings DZ BANK

The façades of the buildings on Pariser Platz follow strict design rules. But what actually happens behind them? The DZ Bank by the Canadian-US architect Frank Gehry has two faces: behind a precisely structured natural stone façade hides an organically shaped auditorium made of steel and glass - the so-called horse's head. Together with a complicated roof construction, it shapes the building's bright inner courtyard and

surprises its visitors with impressive perspectives and reflections. Above the roofs of the building, the skylounge event rooms offer further exclusive insights and views.

Single buildings ACADEMY OF THE ARTS AT PARISER PLATZ

This glass building is the only one by Günter Behnisch in the capital and a real exception not only in this respect. Amongst the stone-clad architecture of Pariser Platz, which is characterised by strict design statutes, the transparent building seems like a countermodel to the Prussian-disciplined façades of its neighbours. Inside, the publicly accessible glass building turns out to be a passage and protective

shell that was placed over the only remaining old building on the square. The skylight halls of the exhibition building from 1908 as well as the large plenary hall and the roof terrace with its spectacular view of the Brandenburg Gate are among the highlights of this architectural tour.

★ Single building "THE BRAIN" AT THE FREE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

With his library extension in the leafy university suburb of Dahlem christened "The Brain", Norman Foster not only created a sensational new building, but at the same time refurbished a historically unique 1960s structuralist edifice and enriched it with his sensitive implant. The so-called "rusty gazebo" of the Free University was a labyrinth in need of renovation and was clearly reorganised in the course of the addition. The

unusually shaped new building is a masterpiece by the British star architect with an extraordinary façade construction and groundbreaking building technology - for the most part without any mechanical support.

★ Single buildings UNITÉ D'HABITATION

The housing machine "Type Berlin" was designed as one of five Unités by the French architect Le Corbusier for the International Building Exhibition of 1957. With its more than 500 social housing units, the building was long regarded as a cautionary example of misguided, inhumane modernism. It was only after the privatisation and refurbishment of the gigantic housing slab and through the dedicated work of a voluntary

association that the true qualities of the structure became apparent. Even without the public roof terrace and the inner service road, the building with its complexly organised flats, some of which are maisonettes, is an outstanding example of modern city living.

🜟 Single buildings JEWISH MUSEUM

Daniel Libeskind's maiden completion is probably the most complex museum building in the city. A house without an entrance, without windows, in an expressive zigzag shape - it objects equally to smooth integration into the city's fabric and to the usual functionality of a museum building. Inside, the building is structured by so-called voids. These voids or hollow bodies, standing on an ideal line, symbolize the irretrievable

destruction of Jewish culture by the Holocaust. Three underground axes stand for the paths taken by Jews in Germany in the 1930s: into hope, into exile or into annihilation.

★ ★ ★ ★ Sidesteps THE BAUHAUS IN DESSAU

Berlin lies only a little over 100km away from Dessau. An excursion to the centre of the Bauhaus movement by bus or train is therefore easily feasible as a day trip. The focal point of any visit to Dessau is the famous Bauhaus building by Walter Gropius and the nearby Masters' Houses. The recently rebuilt Director's House by the architects Bruno, Fioretti, Marquez as a "blurred memory" deserves special attention. A visit to the

Bauhaus Museum opened in 2019 by the young Spanish competition winners Addenda Architects or a tour of the Federal Environmental Agency by Sauerbruch Hutton round off the day trip.

The Saxon city of Leipzig is a good hour away from Berlin by train. It scores with its historic city centre and vibrant student life and can easily be explored on foot. Since the opening of the Picture Gallery by Hufnagel, Pütz & Raffaelian, word has spread that there is highly interesting architecture to be seen here. With other new buildings such as the underground metro stations, the conversion of Europe's largest terminus station into a shopping
